THE OVERVIEW Pack your bags

Antwerp's manageable scale, winding gothic streets and independent shops make for small-town charm with worldly appeal. There's Graanmarkt 13 for contemporary homeware, and staples such as glove-maker Ganterie Boon are unique and alluring. Begin your stroll on the Meir Straat and swing by Schuttershofstraat, Steenhouwersvest and Lombardenvest before discovering some sparkle in the diamond district.





ATELIER SOLARSHOP

Science of selling

Piëtro Celestina and fashion designer Jan-Jan Van Esschehis started this independent shop in the lesser-known Borgerhout district. "We see it as a kind of laboratory," says Celestina. Vintage furniture sits alongside Van Essche's fashion line, with jewellery and art from Belgian and international talent. ateliersolarshop.be

Stepping out

Geert Bruloot and his partner Eddy Michiels opened this men's and women's footwear shop on Schuttershofstraat in 1984 to showcase exemplary shoes such as Martin Margiela's Tabi split-toe slippers. Today it offers global brands from Lanvin to Grenson alongside Belgian designers including Dries Van Noten, Ann Demeulemeester and Raf Simons. coccodrillo be







GRAANMARKT 13

Home from home

This neoclassical townhouse just off the Schuttershofstraat is a contemporary retail space designed by Vincent Van Duvsen. The ground floor is dedicated to fashion and accessories by designers including Belgians Christian Wijnants and Sofie D'Hoore, and Milanese handbag label Paula Cademartori, The rooftop garden supplies herbs and honey for award-winning chef Seppe Nobels' restaurant in the building's basement.

When founders Tim Van Geloven and Ilse Cornelissens opened in 2010 they set out to create a place where everyone would feel at home - which explains the rental apartment upstairs that sleeps six. graanmarkt13.be



This design agency-cumshop was founded in 2010 by creative duo Diana Keller and Brecht Baert (pictured). Their creations, such as tables, lamps and sofas, are complemented by the likes of Belgium-based Ministry of Mass homeware and jewellery by Stephanie Schneider 17. Pull on a cashmere-lined number and don't be afraid of wear and tear: there's a free repair service for buyers.

Get your fill of art and architecture books at this shop on Nationalestraat. Founded by Hilde Peleman more than 25 years ago, it has been at the Modenatie building near Momu since 2001. Large windows cast light on monographs, magazines and coffee-table books heavy on the subject of typography and design; there's also a decent range of stationery.

Design covered

Magazyn is an excellent stop for handsome homeware, stocking everything from paperweights to pillows. It was opened in Steenhouwersvest in 2012 by Thomas Haarmann and is filled with gems, such as vintage Alpha glassware and cotton bedsheets from Italy.

Following the success of his bronze candleholder, German-born Haarmann (pictured) has put together an



exquisite furniture collection and is due to add to the line-up this year. "I always wanted to create a shop suited to my taste and my way of thinking," he says. We're pleased he did. magazyn. be

9 MADE BY HAND Perfectly formed

Functioning as a space for Belgian designers, Made by Hand is a tiny shop near the Kloosterstraat antique district. "Our items are made in limited editions and locally produced," says co-founder Ambrosius Smets. The stock ranges from delicate merinowool scarves by La Femme Garniture to leather bags by Mayenne Nelen and porcelain jewellery by Something Inside. Korte Vlierstraat 17
